

# Clean up to reduce next year's infestations

Good hygiene in October and November in the garden can significantly help reduce pest and disease problems in the future.

## Clean up the greenhouse

Some pests like whitefly only need a few weeds to overwinter on, so make sure you clear out the greenhouse of weeds, especially under benches and on paths. If you are keeping some stock plants over the winter, it is a good idea to hang some sticky traps up in the greenhouse. This will help catch whitefly adults that are still flying on warmer days or in heated areas. Try also to keep some contact acting spray handy to spray off adults you see.

Cleaning your greenhouse is also important, especially the glass, pathways and benches. This will help remove overwintering pests and diseases. Clean glass will also maximise winter light if you are still using the greenhouse for growing.

## Last chance to use nematodes

If you missed doing your late summer nematode applications, October is the last month in the year you can put some nematode products into soil or containers. It is still good practice to apply nematodes against slugs and vine weevil before the end of October. Killing vine weevil larvae and slugs now will reduce infestations next spring.
